

Book or Resource Challenge Procedures

All materials shall be chosen for values of interest and enlightenment of all the students of the community. Materials shall not be excluded solely on the basis that they may contain potentially controversial material, such as that pertaining to race, nationality, or certain political, moral, or religious views. Although the sensational and over-dramatic will be avoided, isolated incidents or profanity should not automatically disqualify material. There shall be the fullest practical provision made for materials presenting all points of view concerning the local, national, and international problems and issues of our times. Materials of sound factual authority shall not be proscribed or removed because of partisan or doctrinal disapproval.

Should a citizen challenge any library materials, the school library media specialist and the complaining citizen should meet to review the school's materials selection policies and procedures, and all the considerations and factors that have influenced the decision to include in the library the offending materials. If the citizen does not agree with the media specialist's position, he/she should be invited to register a formal complaint.

Guidelines Regarding Formal Objections to the Media Collection:

- 1. All challenges shall be made in writing, using the "Citizen's Request for Reconsideration of Library Materials" form.
- 2. The form must be signed and the individual placing the objection identified.
- 3. The form will be given to the school library media specialist for proper action.
- 4. The school library media specialist shall appoint a committee of at least five persons. These persons may include herself, teachers(including curriculum specialist), administration, parents(including a PTO member), and students (depending on the grade level) to consider the challenge.
- 5. The committee will read and review the book (using the attached form).
- 6. Materials shall be judged in total, not on objectionable words or phrases.
- 7. The committee will respond to the challenge with a written reply in a timely manner.
- 8. No material shall be removed from use until a final decision on its status has been made.
- 9. In the event the committee decision is appealed by the complainant, the school library media specialist shall bring the matter to the attention of the Director, with the Board of Education serving as final arbiter.
